Mission From Crash Fatally Wounds Prominent Official

HAD JUST DROPPED AUTO

Victim Had Been Waiting for Street Car at James and Nelson Streets—Suffered Ugly Fractures of Skull—Coroner Examines Drivers of Death After Inquest—Both Held

Torn loose from its fastenings and whirling through the air by the force of a collision with a concrete pile, a door of an automobile struck H. Storrs Bowen prominent Utica, as the door of the car, at James and Nelson streets Saturday afternoon, waiting for a street car, and inflicted a fracture of the skull that rendered the victim unconscious a few hours later.

Was Waiting for Trolley

An automobile traveling south in Nelson street driven by Allen Curtis and a light truck belonging to the Globe Bakingery driven east by James H. Sturges, both residents of 1911 Morris street, crashed together at the cross street. The truck swerved to one side, mounted the curb and collided with a concrete trolley wire pole.

Men Not Blamed
