Fashion Show

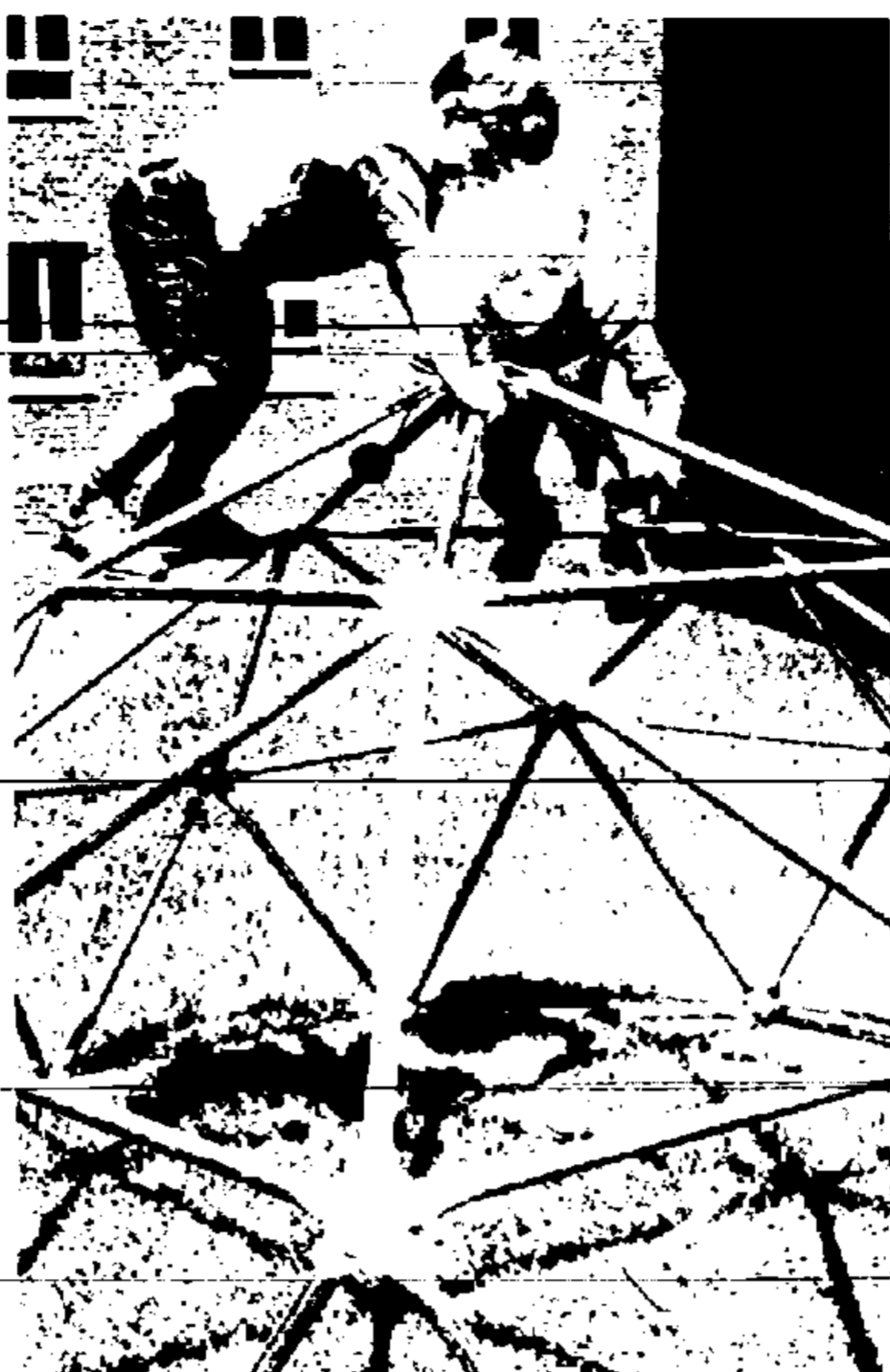
