**Weinberger says retaliation made**

**WASHINGTON** — Acting on intelligence information supplied by the United States, the Salvadoran armed forces have successfully retaliated for the June 19 murders of four Marines and two other Americans, Defense Secretary Caspar W. Weinberger said yesterday.

A senior Pentagon official, who spoke on condition that he not be identified, later disclosed that the Salvadorans had killed 21 guerrillas and captured nine others believed to be members of the organization that killed the Americans.

But a Salvadoran armed forces

spokesman said in San Salvador that "there must have been a misinterpretation" by Weinberger of reports about military strikes against guerrilla camps a month ago.

Weinberger, in an interview with the Mutual Broadcasting System, said the government of El Salvador "with our assistance has taken care of — in one way or another, taken prisoner or killed — a number of the people who participated" in the slaying of the six Americans.

The secretary provided no further elaboration. Fred S. Hoffman, the Pentagon's acting chief spokesman, later explained Weinberger that "did not mean to suggest the actual triggermen had been captured or killed."
