The funeral will be at 10 Saturday from the Owens Funeral Home, Clinton. Burial in South Street Cemetery, Westmoreland.

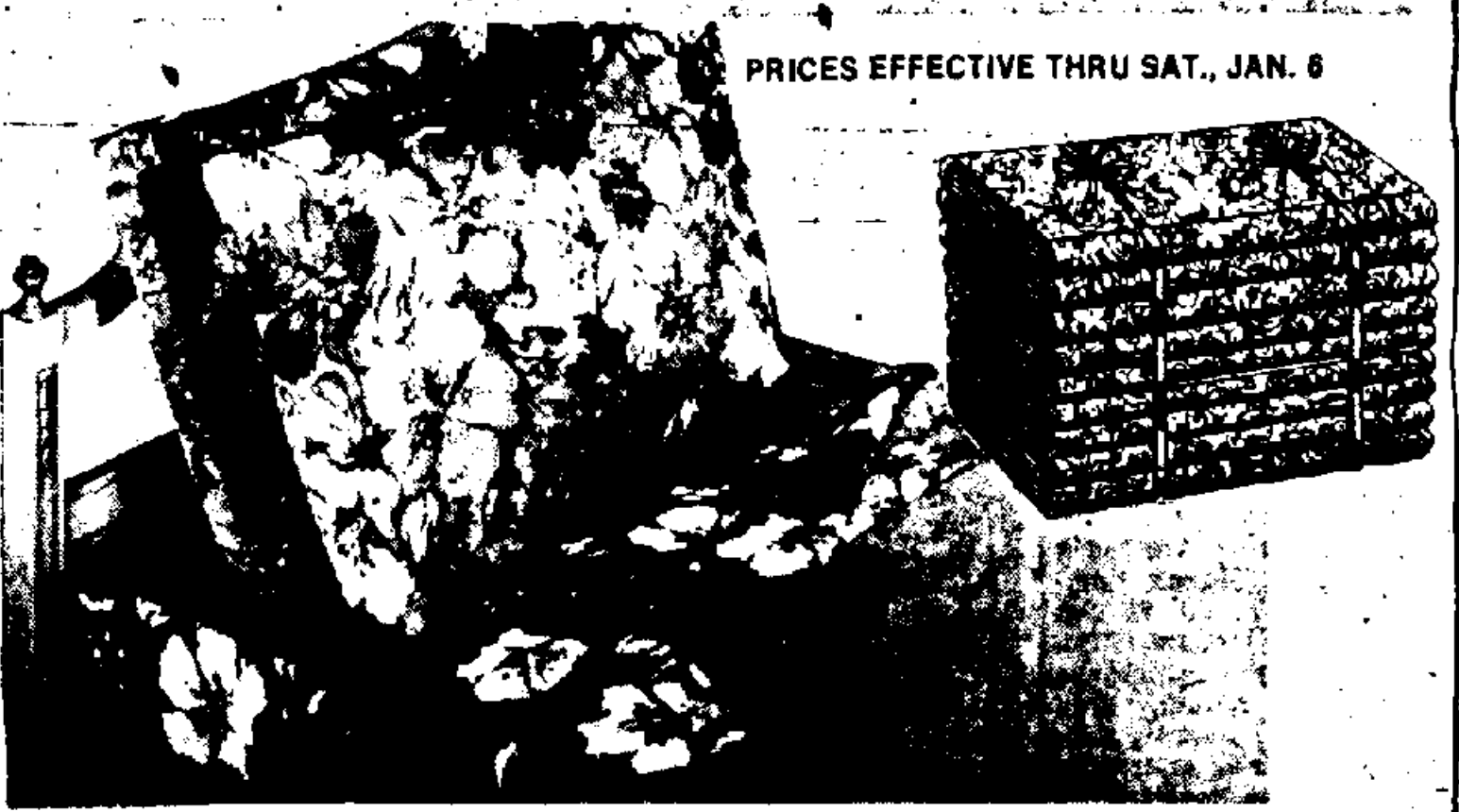
