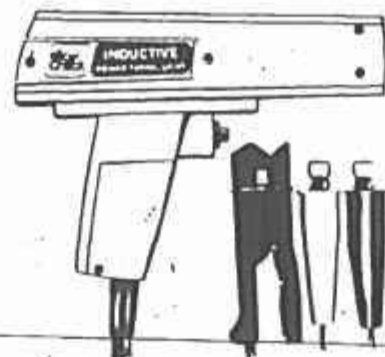

Charles Fisher of Hamilton placed first in sculpture. Second place went to Richard DeAngelo of Syracuse; third to William L. White of New Hartford.

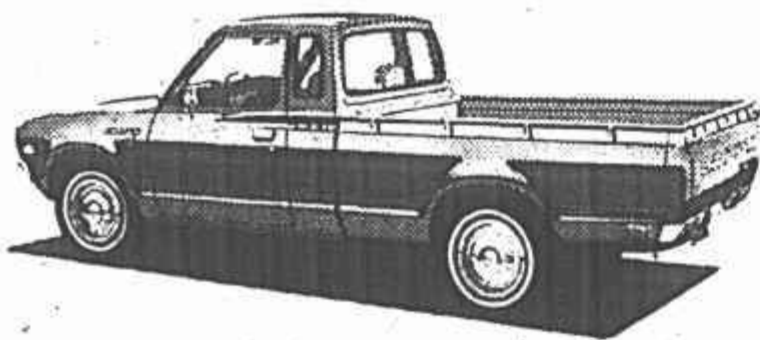
James Ridlon, artist and teacher at Syracuse University, judge of the juried show, selected 36 entries for the exhibition from 57 artists entering.
