
**Witnesses' Convention Expected to Draw 4,500**

**Boehlert Cuts \$6,000 From Jail Study Funds**

Oneida County Executive Sherwood Boehlert has cut by \$6,000 the Jail Advisory Board's request for money to study problems at the county jail. The board asked for \$10,000 to pay two of its members - Thomas Blanchfield of Mohawk Valley Community College and Gary Gordon of SUNY College of Technology - to conduct the study. Both are professors of criminal justice.

Edward Bogan, assistant to the county executive, said the advisory board's request was too broad and that county employees could provide many of the services, such as legal and architectural, for which the advisory board wanted to pay.

Blanchfield said the cut in the funding request means the study will be less comprehensive. He said the \$10,000 would have provided a study that would have included an investigation of where a new jail could be built and a comparison of the costs of building at various sites or expanding the current jail.

However, Boehlert cut the request to \$4,000 before submitting it to the Board of Legislators' Courts and Law Enforcement Committee. The committee will meet June 23.
