WASHINGTON - Acting on intelligence information supplied by the United States, the Salvadoran armed forces have successfully retaliated for the June 19 murders of four Marines and two other Americans, Defense Secretary Caspar W. Weinberger said yesterday.

A senior Pentagon official, who spoke on condition that he not be identified, later disclosed that the Salvadorans had killed 21 guerrillas and captured nine others believed to be members of the organization that killed the Americans.


